Section 1: About the proposal

Title of Proposal

Identification of a proportionate budget saving for the 2023-24 budget to support the overall balanced budget of IJB.

Intended outcome of proposal

This proposal is intended to deliver £0.32m in recurring savings during 2023/24.

The increase to funding by Scottish Government has now plateaued since implementation of the Carers Act (Scotland) 2016. There is an opportunity to work collaboratively with carer and carers support services to develop our future model of provision.

We would seek to avoid the impacts of any service change while supporting collaborative development and an overall approach to achieving a balanced budget and future proofing for the long run.

The saving is identified to allow current contractual commitments to be maintained within the financial year.

We are studying the national strategy as the basis for updating the Argyll & Bute strategy which will be reviewed within this financial year.

Description of proposal

Unpaid carers provide care and support to family members, friends and neighbours. The people they care for may be affected by disability, physical or mental ill health, frailty and substance misuse.

Unpaid carers are a key part of the structure of the delivery of social care in Argyll & Bute as such the priority of maintaining the service.

The proposal is somewhat buffered by the annual investment for the last five years by Scottish Government, having benefited from a net increase each year from £1.1m in 2017/18 to £2.7m in 2023/24. The saving being applied does not impact on the core unpaid carer services and provides some stability in meeting need.

Proposal is to reduce the carers budget by £320k in 2023/24 in discretionary funding to support the achievement of balanced budget.

It is acknowledged that service developments that would have been implemented would have enabled the HSCP to better support its un-paid carers.
