#### Landmark Moments

This month we've reached two landmark moments in our work which I'm delighted to share with you.

With our recent recruitment successes, we now have well over half of the new team in place that's required for the reintroduction of consultant led obstetrics at Dr Gray's and, over the last 3 months, we've seen a consistent increase in the overall percentage of Moray women accessing the midwife led unit and birthing in DGH.

Both of these are exciting and should be celebrated but we also know they are just steps on the journey. (We will be unwavering in our commitment to delivering consultant led obstetrics in Elgin by 2026 and I look forward to bringing you further updates on the progress made over the next few months.

#### **Consultant Supported Triage, DAU & Antenatal Care**

We also have several advancements in our efforts to expand consultant-supported triage, day assessment services and in our antenatal care services at Dr Gray's Hospital. These will help ensure more women with complex pregnancy needs can receive care closer to home. Not least is the introduction of new joint diabetic and perinatal mental health clinics which are due to begin shortly.

#### Recruitment

Recruitment, of course, is ongoing with posts advertised for specialist midwives, anaesthetists, and additional specialty midwives to further bolster our services and enhance our day case assessment capabilities.

#### **Updated Plan**

Finally, on June 5th, 2024, the Maternity Collaborative Joint Programme Board approved our updated project plan. This plan, which outlines our strategic initiatives and timelines, is now available to view in the article included in this newsletter.



### NHS Highland Launches Essential Toilet Stop Map for Pregnant Women Travelling to Inverness

NHS Highland is pleased to announce the launch of a new initiative to support pregnant women travelling from Caithness to Inverness for childbirth.

Recognising the challenges faced by expectant mothers during long journeys, a comprehensive new map of accessible toilet stops that are happy to welcome soon-to-be mums, has been created to help ensure comfort and convenience.

Karen Mackay, Infant Feeding Lead at NHS Highland, worked in collaboration with local businesses, NHS hospitals and Highland Council public toilets to put together list of supportive businesses along the route.



#### **Power of Google**

The new map harnesses the power of Google Maps to highlight all of the participating toilet stops along the route to Inverness, providing an at a glance resource for pregnant women who may need frequent breaks during their journey. This also increases the support offered by public places via participation in the Breastfeeding Scotland Friendly Facilities that NHS Highland have where families are welcomed to stop to feed and change their babies when travelling within Highland.

Karen Mackay said: "We all understand the difficulties that pregnant women can face during long journeys, especially when frequent stops are necessary.

"We want to make things as comfortable and be as supportive as we can and this is just one easy way we thought we could help."

Karen also said the project, which has been viewed more than 1,000 times so far, has already inspired NHS Grampian to look at introducing a similar scheme, is available to anyone via the QR Code or click the button bellow.

# **Recruitment Update**

Major Recruitment Milestone Achieved for Consultant-Led Obstetrics at Dr Gray's Hospital

NHS Grampian is thrilled to announce a significant milestone in the reintroduction of consultant-led obstetrics at Dr Gray's Hospital in Moray.

The team spearheading the initiative has successfully recruited more than half of the personnel required for the newly enhanced service. This includes over 40 new staff members who are already in post, marking a crucial step towards achieving our goal.



The new recruits comprise a wide range of clinical professionals, including midwives, nurses, consultant obstetricians, paediatricians, an anaesthetist, and specialists in various fields such as diabetes, perinatal mental health, early pregnancy loss, and sonography. The new recruits also features a number of staff that will not only serve Moray but also support NHS Highland by working between Elgin and Raigmore.

Jane Gill, Programme Director, said: "This is a significant milestone and one that I know will be especially welcomed by people across Moray. It's taken a lot of work to get here and I want to reassure people that there will be no let-up in our efforts.

### Recruitment Success: Over 250 Healthcare Professionals Keen on Dr Gray's Hospital, Moray and The North of Scotland

As readers of previous editions of the newsletter will be aware, we've been keeping you updated on the summer recruitment roadshows we've been holding at national events across the country.
